Each year in the second semester seniors have an opportunity to work in the Augusta schools vocational program. One yearly opening to these graduates is the opportunity to work as "cadet teachers" in either the elementary or secondary grade rooms throughout the system.

These young people assist the teacher in instructing classes, preparing materials and in some checking of papers. This year 13 students are engaged in this aspect of vocational program. They are paid a small wage and receive one-half unit of credit.

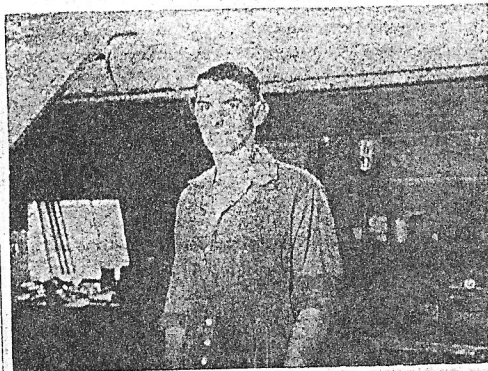

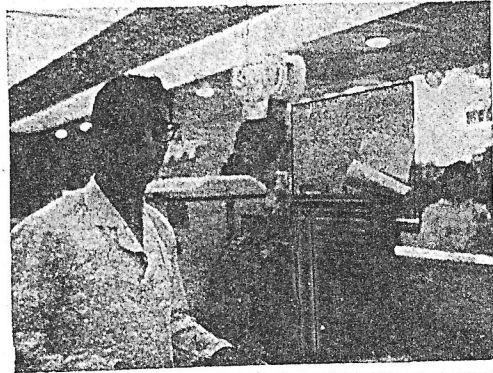

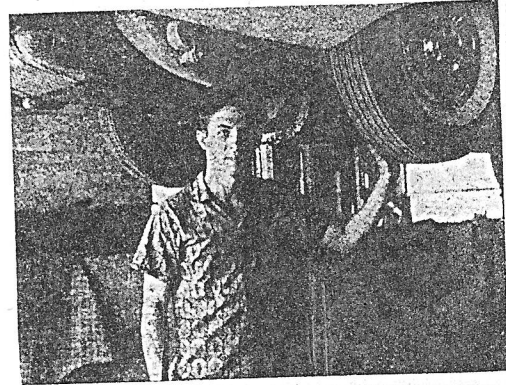

She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Don Danler, Route 2, Augusta.

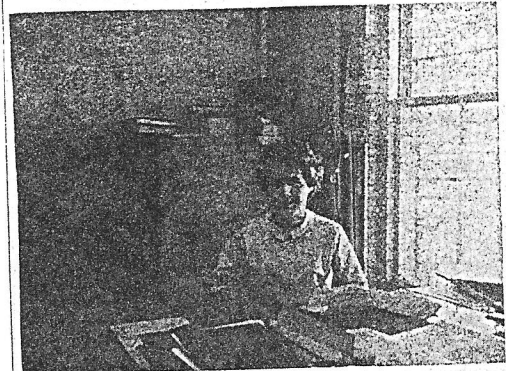
